The main goal of the MAE/CICE degree is similar to the MAE/CI in that it prepares teachers with more curriculum training, but the MAE/CICE focuses on instructing students with how to teach through technology. The main focus of this program is using computers and showing teachers how to effectively fit computers into education.
